

PARTICIPATION

Registration is limited to 80 dancers and 20 musicians, and we aim for gender balance in the dance classes. Applications are considered in the order received. We encourage you to register early, as camp fills up, and we typically have a waiting list.

Dancers must have 1 - 2 years' experience with Scandinavian turning dances. We recommend leather or other smooth soles for ease of turning. You will change partners frequently during dance classes.

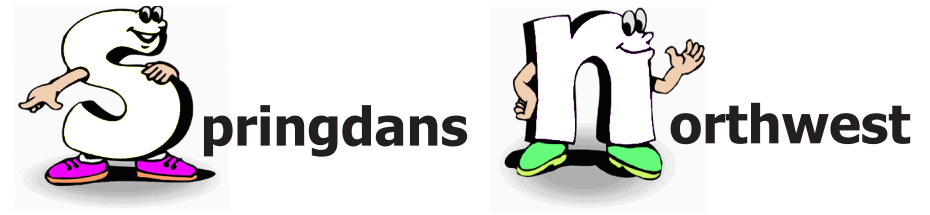
SCHEDULE

Norway's Veslemøy Nordset and Bjørn Sverre Hol Haugen will present Polsdans from Finnskoga at Springdans Northwest, April 16-19, 2010. The dance is popular both in Sweden and Norway, and is part of the rich music and dance traditions of Hedmark and Värmland.

Students give these instructors high marks for their teaching and extensive knowledge of music and dance traditions. This year, they won top honors in their class at the Norwegian *landskappleik* (national dance competition). Bjørn is a renowned dance and costume ethnographer, and Veslemøy is a costume designer.

Music instructors Eva Karlsson and Bruce Sagan will bring joyous music to camp. She is a Swedish fiddler well versed in Finnskoga musical traditions. Her studies took her to Malung's Folkhögskola in Sweden and the Academy of Folk Art in Rauland, Norway. Eva is a tireless, powerful fiddler who loves to share her knowledge with others.

Michigan's Bruce Sagan expresses his love of music with every fiber in his body. A respected musician and teacher of traditional Scandinavian fiddle music, he's one of few non-Swedes awarded the Swedish Zorn Diploma in Bronze for his fiddle playing. Those in a position to know, say that he plays "like a native." Bruce will teach fiddle and nyckelharpa.
